His trip culminated in his first solo exhibitions in Germany, which became a defining moment in his career. Returning to Egypt, he deepened his artistic practice and began gaining widespread recognition both nationally and internationally. Celebrated for his unique style and ability to capture Egyptian everyday life in a way that resonates globally, Abla has exhibited across the world and participated in numerous international biennales.

Abla's early days were shaped by the guidance and support of Egyptian pioneers such as Seif Wanly, Hamed Nada, and Hussein Bicar. Their artistic as well as personal mentorship not only honed his practice but also instilled in him a profound sense of responsibility to uplift and guide future generations of artists. Beyond his artistic accomplishments, Abla has consistently championed the preservation of Egypt's cultural heritage and the protection of its communities, sharing their stories with audiences worldwide.

In Kom Ghorab, Abla spearheaded an initiative that harnessed the power of art to save this historic Cairo district from demolition, transforming its streets with vibrant murals. Similarly, he played a pivotal role in safeguarding Qorsaya Island, a Nile island once under threat of investment-driven displacement, by leading art demonstrations that empowered its residents to recognize the transformative role of art and community. Further cementing his impact, Abla was one of 50 individuals selected to draft Egypt's 2014 constitution, underscoring his contributions and influence to both cultural and national progress.

Driven by a commitment to give back to the world of art from which he has gained so much, Abla has devoted himself to nurturing talent and fostering the global exchange of ideas. Inspired by his teaching experience at the International Summer Academy in Salzburg to nurture young talent and foster the global exchange of ideas, Abla founded the Fayoum Art Center (FAC), a vibrant hub for artists locally and internationally. FAC also houses the Caricature Museum, the first Museum of its kind in the MENA region dedicated to celebrating the art of caricature as a historical and cultural document. These initiatives, among many others, exemplify Abla's unwavering commitment to using art as a tool for education, connection, and societal impact.
